



GIRLS SOFTBALL SPRING/SUMMER 2007

PLATINUM (SENIOR) DIVISION 6TH-8TH GRADE

It is the intent of these rules to teach the youth participants the game of softball. Any action or technique that is contrary to playing the game as it is intended will be considered unsportsmanlike and will not be tolerated.

1. The philosophy of this division is to provide players with little or no experience a structured league environment that they can learn the basic skills and concepts of the game.
2. Senior division is meant to be instructional in nature.
3. Coaches will be provided with, and required to use, roster rotation forms. The intent is to insure all players the same opportunity to play a number of positions, and approximately the same amount of playing time. Coaches are required to allow players to play different positions.
4. Stealing is allowed, and the player can leave the base when the ball leaves the pitcher's hand. Players are only allowed to steal one base at a time, and are not allowed to steal home.
5. Intentional bunts will be ruled an out & runners may not advance.
6. The infield fly rule will not be used.
7. The dropped third strike will be in play, if 1st base is empty.
8. Overthrows: Balls going completely out of play will be ruled a dead ball, **base runners may advance to the next base.** (If the runner is between bases they get to advance to the next base). All balls that stay within the foul lines are considered live (runners may advance at their own risk). The umpire may call time at his or her own judgment.
9. Every player that attends the game will bat. Those players who arrive late will be added to the bottom of the batting order.
10. A half inning will conclude with the end of the batting order or the third out.
11. In an inning a max of (6) players may play the infield and (4) in the outfield.
12. Coaches are not permitted on the playing field during an inning.

13. All infielders excluding the pitcher must be positioned behind the base line and at least 5 feet from the nearest base.
14. Catchers must wear all of the supplied catcher's equipment.
15. An 12-inch softball will be used for the entire season.
16. No leading off will be allowed.
17. Foot first sliding is allowed, absolutely no head first sliding.
18. All players must wear pants.
19. No protests will be allowed and there will be no playoffs.
20. Base distance is 60 feet and pitching distance is 35 feet.
21. Eight (8) players must be present in order to start a game. Players are asked to arrive 20 minutes prior to game time.
22. Game time is forfeit time. The first game of the evening will be the only game allowed the 10 minute grace period. As soon as both teams have the minimum number of players (8) needed to start the game, the game will begin.
23. The umpire will have the official time for the start and completion of the game. Coaches must communicate with the umpire regarding any and or all game time situations.
24. Senior division time limit is 90 minutes, or seven innings. No new inning may begin after the time limit. Check with the umpire who has the official game time.
25. Helmets with chin straps must be worn by all batters and base runners. Any player who removes her helmet intentionally during the game without the umpire's approval will be called out as a base runner or warned as a defensive player.
26. Only league approved softball bats will be permitted. Any bat in question should be presented to the umpire or the on site league supervisor. All illegal bats will be removed from the bench and playing area.
27. The Parks & Recreation Department will provide each child a uniform consisting of a hat, shirt, and pants. Steel cleats & jewelry will not be allowed.
28. Every player that attends a game must play at least two (2) innings defensively. If they are in the infield for the first 2 innings, they must go to the outfield if at all possible for the next two. Continue this process throughout the entire game. If a player has not been attending practices or games on a regular scheduled basis the Parks & Recreation Office should be notified.

29. Any player that is bleeding must leave the game indefinitely until first aid has been administered. A base runner may be replaced by the last person to make an out for that team.
30. When a bat is thrown, the batter will be called out at the umpire's discretion.
31. Rain-outs will be called by the league supervisor. Coaches may call the concession stand from 5 p.m. until game time for rainout information (628-5947) or www.cancellations.com. The Parks & Recreation Department will re-schedule rain-outs on the earliest available date.
32. Team managers are responsible before and after a game for all players, assistant coaches, and spectators associated with their team. Abusive language and or foul actions will not be tolerated by this Parks & Recreation Department. Umpires and the on site league supervisor has the authority to suspend a game for the removal of a player, coach, and or a spectator. Any person ejected from a game will have two (2) minutes to be out of sight & sound.
33. No negative chanting or chattering at an opposing player or team is allowed. Teams are asked to shake hands after each game under their coaches' supervision.
34. The Director of Parks & Recreation has the authority to amend league rules, schedules, or league changes in order to accommodate a physically challenged participant under the A.D.A or in the best interest of the entire league.
35. Any incident in which a player or coach is ejected by an official will result in that individual sitting out the remainder of the game as well as the next scheduled game. Offenses include but are not limited to: fighting, foul language, abuse of official, and unsportsmanlike conduct.

The no leading off rule shall be enforced as follows:

Once the ball leaves the pitchers hand, the play is considered live and runners may advance off of the base (including the relaxed step) at their own risk.

For the 7:30pm games, no new inning shall start after 8:45pm. The games are ending in darkness and this becomes a safety issue.
